# 2013: Our 20th Year of Service to Haiti

2013 marked 20 years of service, research and education for Family Health Ministries in Haiti. In 1993, Dr. David Walmer took his first trip to Haiti with Triangle Presbyterian Church in Durham, North Carolina. That trip changed his life and launched a ministry to build and sustain healthy families in Haiti. In 2000, Family Health Ministries became our official name and today we have a US staff of 9 and employ 80 Haitians to operate a family health clinic (Monday-Friday), 6 cervical cancer prevention programs, a guesthouse, a school and an orphanage.

This report highlights FHM's activities and success of 2013. All of these accomplishments would not have become a reality without the faithful partnership and support of our donors, sponsors, and volunteers. It is only through this continued support of time, money and prayers that we can step forward together into the next 20 years. We greatly thank you for your affirmation and dedication to the work of Family Health Ministries.

## **Progress**

#### 1st HPV Lab Opens in Haiti + 5 New HPV Screening Clinics

2013 began with the expansion to the Family Health Ministries' cervical cancer screening program in Haiti. With the award of a large grant from the Clinton Bush Haiti Fund (2012), 5 new clinics were open in Port-au-Prince to provide HPV screening for cervical cancer and the first HPV lab became operational. Cynthia Jones of QIAGEN arrived in Haiti mid-June and provided training to the laboratory staff making the HC2 assay available in Haiti. Prior to 2013, all HPV samples were sent to the US for processing. Towards the end of 2013, Family Health Ministries work was highlighted in a PLOS One publication entitled "Human Papillomavirus Prevalence in a Population of Women Living in Port-au-Prince and Leogane, Haiti" by David K. Walmer, Paul S. Eder, Laura Bell, Hiam Salim, Lori Kobayashi, Jackie Ndirangu, Nicole Tinfo, and Phillip E. Castle.

# Completion

#### Saint Antoine School Opens for 750 Students

Three years after the devastating earthquake that rocked the Fondwa community, the children were able to move from their make-shift temporary class rooms to their new school. The Saint Antoine School welcomed children back in October 2013. The dedication ceremony was held on January 10, 2014 in observance of the 4th anniversary of the 2010 earthquake. "After many years of hard work and dedication, we give thanks for this amazing new school and for all those who helped to make this dream a reality," says Kathy Walmer, FHM Executive Director. The Saint Antoine School has 750 Fondwa students, grades pre-K through 13, a significant increase in enrollment from past years. The new school building is three stories tall with 11 classrooms and administrative space.

Some students walk 2-3 hours through the mountainous region of Fondwa to have the opportunity to attend the Saint Antoine School. It is hard to resist the excitement of the students in this rural mountain community where education is not a right, but a true gift that is not taken for granted.

# Service

#### FHM Hosts 153 Volunteers in Haiti

FHM introduced many new people to Haiti in 2013. Friends old and new traveled with us to provide service to the global community through education, research, and mission teams. FHM hosted seven Duke Engage students during the summer who worked on PTSD and Hypertension studies in the community of Leogane. Max Kilingerman, a Stanford University medical student, did research on GIS Mapping of health care post-earthquake in the Leogane area. Four more student volunteers spent their summer working in Fondwa at the Fatima House Orphanage and Saint Antoine School. 18 team trips with a total of 153 volunteers provided medical care at the Blanchard Clinic, Vacation Bible School, and construction projects in Fondwa. Jamalyn and Dave Williamson, with the help of many team members, completed the construction of the 2 houses in Fondwa and installed a new water system/cistern at the Saint Antoine School.







## Success

### **Blanchard Clinic Provides Care for 6,417 Patients**

A decade ago, Pastor Leon Dorleans first approached FHM with a vision for healthcare in the community of Blanchard, a suburb of Port-au-Prince. The Blanchard Clinic, one of FHM's most successful programs, provides family health services including prenatal care, cervical cancer prevention screening, infant immunizations, and treatment for acute and chronic health issues. Over the years, a second floor was added to the facility to house its women's health program. 
## **Program Expenses (%)**
