## Evaluating Outcomes for 2014 and Looking to the Future

Compiling our annual report is a wonderful time to reflect on the many adventures that have transpired over the past year, while giving us an opportunity to see the bigger picture and to evaluate the impact of our daily support in the communities we serve. In 2014, 4,000 women were screened for cervical cancer at the Blanchard Clinic, another 16 partner clinics joined Family Health Ministries (FHM) to bring HPV screening to their communities, and more than 23,000 women have been screened since the inception of FHM's HPV screening program in 2007.

Other accomplishments for 2014 include: over 1000 children received immunizations and another 6,658 patients received primary health care at the Blanchard Clinic, and 630 children attended the Saint Antoine School. These remarkable numbers remind us that the faithful support of a few hardworking community leaders can make a significant impact in the lives of many.

All of FHM's programs are operated in-country by Haitian staff and supervised by Haitian leadership. As a result, these milestones are not the accomplishments of FHM, but those of our energetic and inspiring Haitian friends and colleagues whom you support. With those resources, our Haitian friends enthusiastically and

gratefully provide all of the manual labor, health care, education, and services that you will read about in this report.

As we sprint into 2015, we are excited about a number of new programs and the opportunity to support our growing Haitian staff. That said, we know none of this would be possible without you, our faithful and growing network of partners. Through your gifts of time, money, and prayers, we anticipate the continued success of existing programs as well as the successful beginnings of new exciting opportunities. The Carmelle Voltaire Women's Health Center in Tom Gato is ahead of schedule and expected to open in the Fall of 2015. We and the Tom Gato community are excited to see what this new facility, built in partnership with the Building Goodness Foundation, will add to the community.

We are blessed to have you as a member of our family, grateful that you continue to help us tell the FHM story, and thankful for your ongoing encouragement and support!

# ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2014

## Saint Antoine School Dedication

January 10, 2014: FHM Executive Director, Kathy Walmer, was in Fondwa for the dedication of the new Saint Antoine School. The new school is three stories tall with eleven new classrooms and administrative space. The original school was destroyed in the 2010 earthquake. The school provides education - preschool through the 13th grade - for approximately 630 Fondwa students.



## FHM Featured in *The New York Times*

May 2014: Family Health Ministries' Founder and Board Chairman, Dr. David Walmer, M.D., Ph.D. was featured in a *New York Times* article, "The MacGyver Cure for Cancer," which discussed his development of the Cerviscope, a portable, battery-powered colposcope. The Cerviscope assists to better screen women in low-resource countries, such as Haiti, for cervical lesions that, if untreated, cause cervical cancer. Publication of the article resulted in an increase in sales of the Cerviscope, increased awareness of FHM's programs, and new medical providers seeking to participate on medical mission trips.



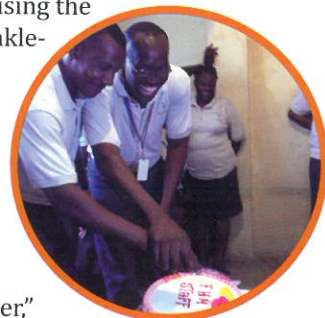
## Duke SRT Students in Haiti

June 2014: FHM collaborated for the first time with the Duke Global Health Institute (DGHI) as a community partner for the Student Research Training (SRT) Program. The program gave second and third year Duke University undergraduate students an opportunity to engage in global health research in real-life settings. Garland Austin, Elle Gault, Zach Morrow and Lily Zerihun worked in Leogane to complete 315 HPV vaccine surveys, and 409 interviews using the hypertension survey, followed by blood pressure and ankle-brachial assessments.

June 2014: Blanchard Clinic staff Napeau Chrisnel, Clinic Manager, and Annaus Franckel, Data Manager, celebrated 10 years of service with FHM. "We are proud to partner with FHM who supports our work to provide healthcare and services that make our community stronger," said Annaus Franckel.

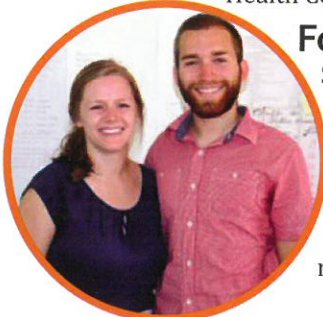


## FHM Fundraiser in Europe

July 9-12 2014: Roland Hofer, of Carmel, Indiana raced across Europe in the "Salomon 4 Trails" competition. In three days, he ran through the mountains of Germany, Austria, and Switzerland, traversing 100 miles and 33,000 feet of vertical climbing, in 30 hours of running. His trek, named Roland4Fondwa, was dedicated to raising awareness and funds for FHM's Carmelle Voltaire Women's Health Center and generated over \$13,000 of support.

## Fondwa In-Country Coordinators

September 2014: FHM welcomed Christopher and Natalie Wallace to serve as In-Country Fondwa Project Coordinators. The Wallaces, under the direction of Jamalyn Williamson, FHM's Fondwa Project Manager, chose to live in Fondwa for one year to support FHM's sponsorship program and on going service projects in the community.



## Race Raises \$35k for Women's Clinic

September 27, 2014: FHM teamed up with 519 Church and local sponsors to offer a certified 10k/5k and 1 mile family fun run along the beautiful American Tobacco Trail in Cary, North Carolina. Over 450 folks came out to run and walk, and proceeds from event sponsorship, donations, and race registration fees raised \$35,000 for FHM's Carmelle Voltaire Women's Health Center. "Our goal was to register 350 runners and raise \$10,000 in order to receive an additional \$10,000 through a matching grant from the SG Foundation," said Kathy Walmer. "We were surprised and grateful for the abundance in attendance and support."



## Building Projects in Fondwa

October 2014: Kids First, a group from Indianapolis, Indiana donated the funds to complete a cistern that will allow more water to be stored at the Fatima House Orphanage. During the rainy season, it provides adequate water for the 50 children who live there. Construction began on a new dining hall for the Fatima House children, and two more homes were built for two Fondwa families. Ten homes have been built since 2011.

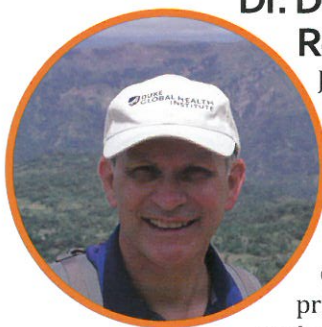






## LANDMARK ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2014

### Dr. David Walmer Presents HPV Research to Haitian Ministry of Health



June 30, 2014: Dr. David Walmer presented to the Haitian Ministry of Health at a Cervical Cancer Prevention Workshop. Dr. Grand Pierre, Director of Family Health, invited speakers from the Ministry of Health, PIH, GHESKIO and FHM to share their experiences with cervical cancer prevention and their vision for a national program. FHM recommended that Haiti adopt HPV testing as the preferred primary screening protocol and introduced digital pathology with the message that therapy should be based on a pathological diagnosis whenever possible. Everyone present enthusiastically endorsed both of these recommendations and expressed a desire to work together in order to more effectively compete with other countries for global resources.

### Breaking Ground on New Women's Clinic



December 2014: After many months of planning, changing directions, and planning again, we finally broke ground on the Carmelle Voltaire Women's Health Center in Tom Gato, Haiti. Our partner, Michael Anello, In-Country Project Manager for Building Goodness Foundation, was an integral part of this project, working tirelessly to help secure the land and stay on course for construction. The facility will provide a place for women to come together, to encourage and educate each other on health care needs and receive services such as contraception, prenatal care, and safe delivery. Most importantly, the center will provide the Fondwa area access to skilled birth attendants for the first time.

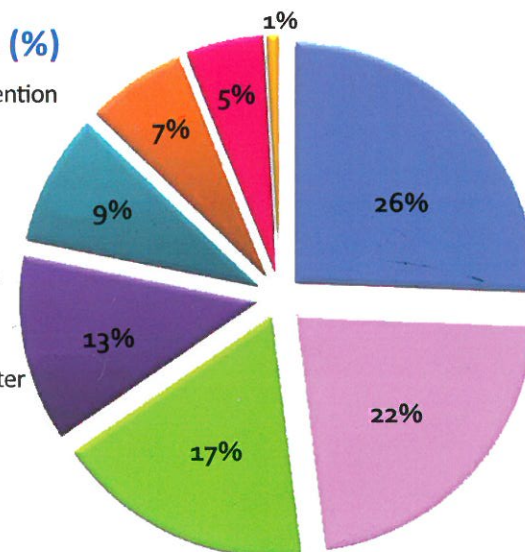

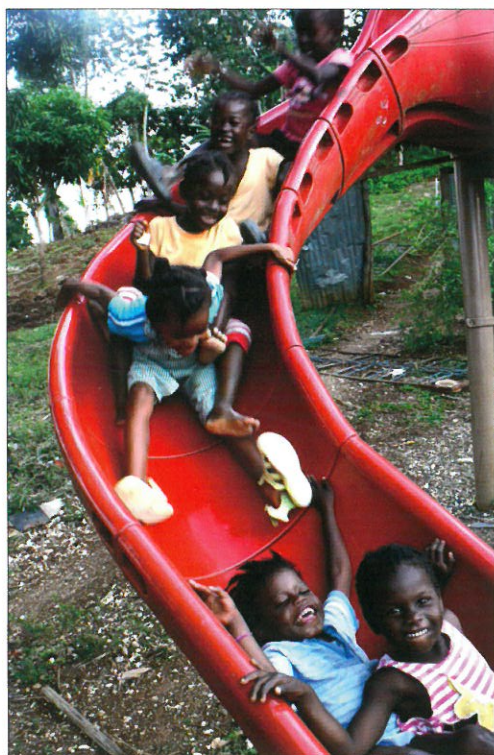
