The Nancy Ferree-Clark Guesthouse is the first building in the Leogane Family Health Center. The guesthouse offers housing for visiting health care providers. It is also open to the public for meals, lodging, and meeting space, and is intended to help defray the costs of running the preventive health center. The building is named in honor of a beloved pastor from Duke Chapel in Durham, NC, who served from 1984 to 2010.

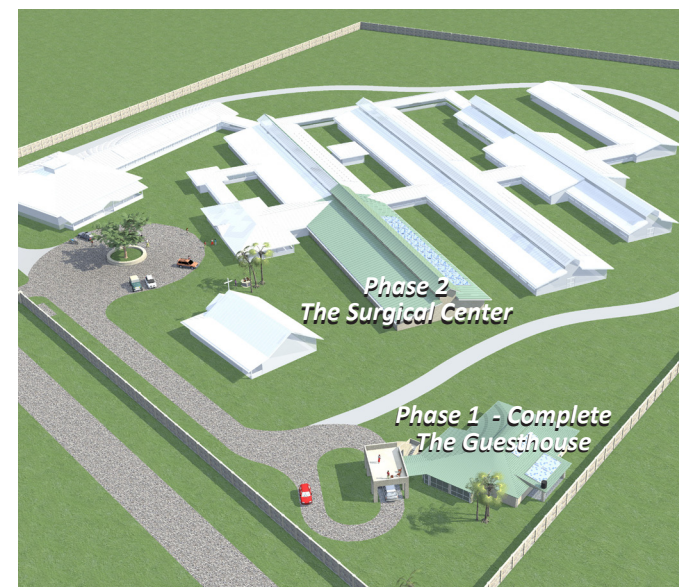

Help us to provide life-saving medical treatments in Haiti

Even before the devastating earthquake of 2010, people in the Leogane area were in dire need of a women and children's health center. Family Health Ministries seeks to satisfy this need by building The Leogane Family Health Center.

The Leogane Family Health Center will be a 10-acre, \$11M, 100,000-square-foot preventive health care complex, serving those without access to basic care in the Leogane Commune in southwest Haiti. The facility will eventually feature 24 outpatient exam rooms, multiple operating rooms, 54 inpatient beds, administrative space, a chapel, and a community auditorium. The Center will function as research and teaching resource for Haitian and American health care workers and students. It will be a vital resource for global health research and shared health worker training between visiting American medical teams and Haitian medical staff.

The Surgical Center

A startling number of Haitian women die each year from cervical cancer and pregnancy

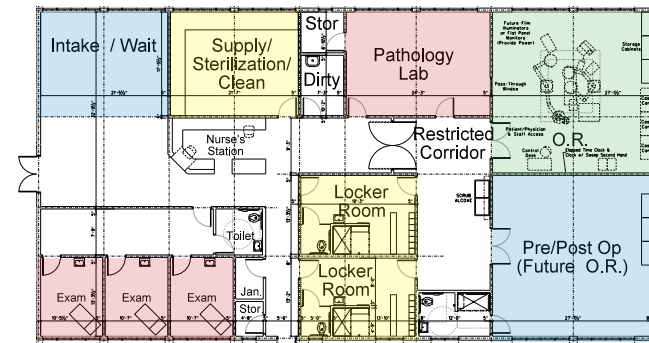
related complications. The maternal death rate in Haiti is the highest of any country in the western hemisphere. In Haiti, 49.2% of cancer deaths are from cervical cancer, compared to 2.5% in North America.

Haitian women are the foundation of their family as the primary caretaker and income producer. There is a critical need for a surgical facility in the Leogane area that offers affordable medical access to the women and children who are otherwise going without.

Family Health Ministries is currently fund-raising for the construction and start-up of Phase 2: The Surgical Center. We are working to reduce the burden of maternal death by providing much needed medical care, screening and healthcare education to the Haitian community, and we need your help to make it happen. The Leogane Family Surgical Center will not only provide cervical cancer screening, but also cervical disease treatment options and obstetrical and gynecological emergency surgeries.
